IPAF Safety Zone at bauma

The IPAF Safety Zone at bauma (Outdoor Area F10, Stand N1014/9) is one of the largest displays at the show and will focus on how to choose the right equipment and how to use harnesses correctly.

The more than 1,700 square metre IPAF Safety Zone features 25 pieces of equipment from leading international manufacturers. Trained and qualified personnel will demonstrate emergency escape from one of the largest vehicle-mounted platforms through abseiling. There will also be live demonstrations of the dangerous effect of soft ground conditions on outriggers.

"The abseiling is very dramatic and illustrates important safety principles," said Reinhard Willenbrock of IPAF-Deutschland. "Always do a job-specific risk assessment prior to commencing any work at height. Select the appropriate equipment and ensure that all operators are properly trained."

Bauma will also see the launch of a worldwide campaign, Clunk Click, to encourage all users of boom type platforms to wear a full body harness with a short restraint lanyard attached to a suitable anchor point. The campaign started as a grassroots initiative by the UK Powered Access Interest Group (PAIG), a joint committee of the Construction Plant-hire Association and IPAF. Thousands of Clunk Click posters and

stickers have been printed to spread the message.

"The major rental companies took the initiative because fatal accidents were happening as a result of users being catapulted out of boom platforms because they were not wearing harnesses when they should have been," said IPAF managing director Tim Whiteman. "Boom users should follow the simple advice outlined in IPAF's technical guidance note H1 and save lives."

Different versions of Clunk Click will be launched, including the German "Click Clack", the Italian "Clic Clac" and the North American "Click It".

During bauma, IPAF is hosting a series of short workshops on three topics: correct use of harnesses, training and typical accidents. The workshops will be given in English and German. Vouchers entitling platform operators to reduced price courses at participating training centres in Germany will be distributed at the IPAF stand. Visitors to the IPAF stand who show a PAL Card will be rewarded with a goody bag filled with varying items including clothing and gifts from IPAF members.

New ANSI standard

AWPT, IPAF's North American subsidiary, has analysed the new standard ANSI/SIA A92.6 – 2006 Self-Propelled Elevating Work Platforms, which applies to scissor lifts. The standard will go into force later this year.

"The A92.6-2006 standard contains numerous changes, but it is essentially an effort to make it consistent with the current versions of A92.3 and A92.5-2006," said Dennis Eckstine, AWPT Vice-President. A92.3 is the standard for manually propelled elevating work platforms while A92.5 applies to boom-supported elevating work platforms.

Some of the changes are:

- Changes in definitions for familiarisation, guard rail system, manual of responsibilities and others;
- Changes in responsibilities of manufacturers;
- Changes to language for fall protection and anchorage(s);
- Changes to language concerning inspection and record retention.

Training the trainer

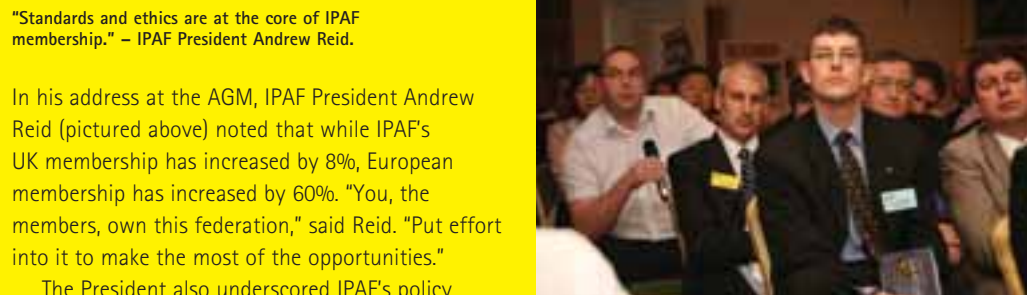
Professional development seminars (PDS) for German and Spanish language instructors were held in January and March in Zurich, Frankfurt and Madrid. At these annual seminars, yearly updates to the IPAF training programme are presented and new training material is distributed. The seminars serve as a forum of guidance and open discussion for instructors. Upcoming PDS events are 5 June in Bologna for Italian language instructors and 19 September at the Haydock Racecourse for UK instructors.

In his address at the AGM, IPAF President Andrew Reid (pictured above) noted that while IPAF's UK membership has increased by 8%, European membership has increased by 60%. "You, the members, own this federation," said Reid. "Put effort into it to make the most of the opportunities."

The President also underscored IPAF's policy to get tough in the name of safety and service.

"Standards and ethics are at the core of IPAF membership," said Reid. "We will not tolerate cowboys and corner-cutting. Naming and shaming will continue."

In his report, IPAF managing director Tim Whiteman gave an optimistic forecast of the federation's future. IPAF manufacturers build about 80% of platforms on the market and own about one-third of the worldwide rental fleet. In the UK, IPAF members own about 90% of the rental fleet. In Germany, the figure is about 50%.
